Gene Haas Foundation Scholarship

Guidelines

1. Senior students enrolled in Precision Engineering & Machining are eligible to apply
2. Applicants must be enrolled in and attending either an accredited full four-year college or an accredited two-year technical institute. Applicants must be from Ashtabula County. Applicants must be employed in a full-time capacity in an organization in field of study.
3. Scholarships will be for a one-year period.
4. The \$1000.00 Gene Haas Foundation Scholarship shall be awarded to an A-Tech student enrolled in and attending a four year or two year or school of technology related to field of study. The \$1000.00 scholarship will be disbursed in two parts. The first part (\$500.00) will be given upon proof of attendance of the recipient in the first semester. The second part (\$500.00) will be given upon proof of attendance of the recipient in the second semester.

Two (2) \$250.00 Gene Haas Foundation Scholarships shall be awarded to an A-Tech student who is to be employed in a full-time position related to field of study.

5. The College/Technology student award will be made directly to the recipient upon his/her notifying Mr. Wludyga in writing of registration and submitting proof of attendance at a college or technical institute.
 - 5a. The tool award will be made to the recipient upon his/her providing to Mr. Wludyga a letter from the employer confirming full-time employment and a listing and value of required tools for the position.
6. **Incomplete applications will not be considered.** A complete application will include all of the following:
 - (1) a statement of your career goals and why you would be an acceptable candidate for this scholarship program. Please give any additional information you care to that is not covered in the formal application.
 - (2) This two-page application completed by you.
 - (3) A transcript of all credits earned in high school. Copies accepted.
 - (4) Two letters of recommendation stating your qualifications. One must be from a high school instructor. The other may be from any person who knows you well.
7. Applicants are to submit application in a sealed envelope with their name on the outside.
8. **Applications must be received by Mr. Wludyga by May 1st for consideration for the scholarship. No late applications will be considered.** The information asked for in this application is necessary in order for us to determine the award winners. Please submit your application packet to:
