The Knoedler School of Practical Nurse Education is an 11-month program beginning in September. Classes meet daily Monday through Friday 8:00 AM – 3:30 PM. Clinical hours at a healthcare facility are variable and subject to change to meet the facility's schedule. The program is approved by the Ohio State Board of Nursing and accredited by the Council on Occupational Education (COE). It has been developed to prepare the student to perform basic nursing skills under the direction of a licensed physician or registered nurse.

The program includes nursing theory and planned clinical experience in a variety of health agency settings. Students have assignments to complete online. Home computer access is highly encouraged but the school does have a computer lab available from 7 a.m. – 10:00 p.m., Monday-Thursday. Upon completion of the program, the student is eligible to take the National Council Licensure Examination for certification as a licensed practical nurse if state board requirements are met. Licensure as a practical nurse is dependent upon successful completion of the practical nursing program and passing the NCLEX examination.

Knoedler School of Practical Nurse Education meets Ohio's state educational requirements for professional licensure as a LPN. Knoedler has not made a determination of whether the curriculum meets educational requirements in any other state

The LPN program is top 10 in Ohio according to practicalnursing.org.

Convenient advancement to a registered nurse (R.N.) is available through the Ashtabula County Technical & Career Campus LPN to RN program.

FUTURE EMPLOYMENT

"Employment of licensed practical and licensed vocational nurses is projected to grow 9 percent from 2020 to 2030, about as fast as the average for all occupations.

About 60,700 openings for licensed practical and licensed vocational nurses are projected each year, on average, over the decade. Many of those openings are expected to result from the need to replace workers who transfer to different occupations or exit the labor force, such as to retire."*



ADMISSION CRITERIA

Practical Nurse Education requires that the student adjust to many and varied situations. It is expected that the student have a definite interest in helping others. Above all, the student must have maturity, emotional stability, and good communication skills.

Criteria for selecting students is the responsibility of the school's Admission Committee but includes:

- Satisfactory scores on the pre-entrance test (TABE test: sample questions can be found at https://tabetest.com Test D)
- High School graduate or equivalency
- Three work/professional references
- Personal interview with program director or faculty member

PLEASE NOTE:

Physical examination report is required after acceptance and prior to enrollment which must include a mandatory drug screen, proof of COVID vaccine, immunizations for Tdap, Hepatitis B, MMR, and Varicella. Influenza will be required at a later date.

Background fingerprinting will be done on all students prior to the start of their clinical experience. Should anything other than a minor traffic violation be uncovered, the student may be refused admission to selected health care facilities; hence will be unable to graduate. (Clinical experience is mandatory for completing objectives required for graduation.)
